#### **Book First – Year 6**

Book First welcomes Year 6! We are excited to roll it out and get books into the hands of our first graders. Here's what is planned so far: Book First Team meetings began in September with the decision to replicate Year 5 due to the ongoing pandemic. Christie Hamm, Manager of Youth and Literacy Services and Meghan Casey, K-12 Specialist, will be leading the Sacramento Public Library team and the Friends team will be myself along with Katherine McMillan.

The books have been ordered and will arrive soon. All the remaining books from Year 4 and 5 were inventoried and added to Year 6 for distribution. Book First will serve an additional eight schools this year, for a total of 180 schools and an estimated 14,000 first grade students receiving Book First books.

Because of the generous support for this program last May on the Big Day of Giving we will have enough money to fund these books for all the students. If you missed that opportunity in May, there is still time to donate to this program on the Friends of the Library website. Donations are already coming in for Year 7.

Volunteers will again be needed this year to assemble book packets, either at home or in-person work parties at the Central Galleria. Safety details were still being worked out at the time of this writing, but it was hoped that these inperson work parties will happen in November. Like last year students will receive two books, one fiction and one nonfiction along with an activity sheet and a letter to parents about this program and the public library. Friends volunteers are invited to take part in virtual classroom visits with our stellar Youth Services Librarians. Ask us about training!


In November, we will re-institute the monthly Members only Friday night sale. These will be the Friday before the first warehouse sale of the month. The first two will be November 5th and December 3rd from 5pm to 8pm. More dates will be posted on our website. If you're not yet a member, you can join at the door.

Our September bag sales were a huge success for us and for our customers. We will look at Spring for another round. Thanks to all the volunteers who worked that day and those who tried to keep the shelves full in between sales. And a big thanks to our wonderful customers.

Donations are continuing to pour in. I know it's confusing about the days for donations so I'll try to explain. We take donations on Wednesdays and Saturdays from 9am to noon. The exceptions are the Wednesday before a warehouse sale and the day of the sale. It's not unusual to get several donations of 20-30 boxes each in one day, and they fill the aisles. If this happens on the Wednesday before a sale the volunteers can't get all those boxes and bags emptied out in time for shoppers. 

#### Acting On Our Feelings of Gratitude: The Young Readers Fund

At this time of year, we give thanks for people and places that fulfill our lives. For many of us, one of those places is the Sacramento Public Library and one of the people is Rivkah Sass, its leader for the past twelve years. With Rivkah's retirement approaching at the end of December, the Friends have created the Young Readers Fund to show our gratitude.

The Young Readers Fund honors Rivkah and will extend her legacy at the Library. As an endowed fund, it will fuel new initiatives to enhance children's reading abilities, as well as supporting current materials and projects for children. We are approaching 70% completion of the \$100,000 goal and are announcing a new \$5,000 challenge grant from Alan and Helen Yee and the Herbert and Inez Yee Foundation to be matched by other community members as Rivkah's retirement date ticks closer.

As writer William Arthur Ward once said, "Feeling gratitude and not expressing it is like wrapping a present and not giving it." Let's give this present to the young readers of Sacramento County, present and future, in Rivkah's honor.
